ROLE PURPOSE/SUMMARY	This post will provide clinical, research and organisational support to the Gut Health workstream of the GCRF Action Against Stunting Hub.		
SCOPE/BACKGROUND	The GCRF Action Against Stunting Hub, led by the London International Development Centre (LIDC), combines expertise from several different disciplines to develop a new typology of stunting in young children in LMICs. The aim is to provide fresh insights to develop innovative and novel interventions to prevent and ameliorate stunting. The research is organised in inter-related workstreams and include epigenetics, microbiome, nutrition, early child development and home, education and food environments. The Hub will recruit observational cohorts of 600 newborns in Kaffrine District, Senegal, urban Hyderabad, India and East Lombok, Indonesia with follow-up to age 2 years.		
	The Gut Health workstream, led by LSTM, will monitor biomarkers of gut health in blood and stool samples, growth, episodes of illness and mortality up to age 2 years. The effects of a synbiotic intervention from birth to age 6 months on linear growth and gut health biomarkers will also be assessed in a prospective, randomised trial in infants in Senegal.		
	The Post holder will be based at LSTM but provide support remotely and during extended site visits to the three in-country teams. Support will be provided with data collection, management and analysis, sample collection and analysis and interpretation of findings in the observation cohorts and interventional study.		
	The post holder will be expected to undertake teaching and training responsibilities as part of the Department of Clinical Sciences, LSTM.
