**Topic Guide for In-depth Individual Interviews  
May 2019**

I would like to start by asking you about any groups, networks or associations to which you belong. These could be formally organized groups or informal groups of people who get together regularly to do an activity or to talk about things.

1. Which groups or associations do you belong to? Can you describe each of them?
  - a. If none, why? Are there any groups you are aware of? Can you tell me about a few?
  - b. What is stopping you from joining any of these?
2. Of the groups you belong to, which is the most important to you or your household? Why?
3. Please describe the members of the group that is most important to you. How are the members similar or different? Are most of them of the same gender? Same religion? Same tribal background?
4. In what way does this group interact with other groups within your village? How does it interact with groups outside of your village?
5. If you suddenly needed to borrow a small amount of money (to pay for your needs for one week) whom would you ask for help? Why?
6. If one of your children falls ill and you need assistance, who would you ask for help? Why?
7. Generally speaking, do you think that most people in your village can be trusted? Why or why not? Do you think your immediate neighbors can be trusted?
8. Do you feel that most people in your village are willing to help if you need it? Why or why not? How about your immediate neighbors, would they help you?
9. Can you tell us where you get information about health services, such as immunizations for children and antenatal care for women?
  - a. Do you trust this information? Why or why not?
10. Please tell me about the last time your child was ill (diarrhea, fever, cough).
  - a. What did you do? Did you seek care? Explain why or why not?
  - b. What stopped you from seeking care? Can you give an example?
